

We aimed to strengthen our leadership team and expand operational capacity, establish the Common Ground brand within Calgary, implement an awareness campaign targeting North Central Calgary, and advocate for vital infrastructure and municipal services essential for our vision at The Junction.

Through strategic expansion, we welcomed new team members and dedicated volunteers who enriched our operations and increased our community impact. Our outreach campaigns, events, and consistent public engagement efforts significantly raised awareness, deepening our relationships within the city. We reached important advocacy milestones, effectively positioning Common Ground to secure critical infrastructure from the City of Calgary. ### The Common Ground Foundation Story

In 1905, the Pole family purchased their very first piece of land in Alberta. At the time, Alberta was not a separate province yet.

It became an official province later that year! Since then, the family have had their roots deep in the farming community.

My father purchased his first farm at 21 years old. That was 1947, and distance was still measured in miles instead of kilometres!

That land is now the community of Beddington, in Calgary. Al and his siblings grew up on that farm...

I grew up on our first family farm until age 13. It was a great childhood. I remember playing shinny hockey at the nearby rink in Huntington Hills, but my favourite pastime was riding my minibike around the land. It took us an hour to bus to school in Airdrie, and we spent the ride teasing the bus driver. Joke's on me, since he later dated my sister!

Developers bought our farm in 1971 and asked us to move in 1976 so they could begin building the community of Beddington. We moved about 5 miles (8 kilometres) north to a new farm - where Livingston is now being developed. I upgraded from a Honda 50 to a Yamaha 80 motorcycle. Eventually, I set out on my own, met and married Brenda, and we started our own family.





In 2003, our family made the decision to move back onto the family farm with Al's father. He was a great person and very easy to live with!

That was the beginning of our new Calgary chapter. Then in 2005 Al's dad sold the Livingston family farm, and we found our new home nearby.


Later on that year, Al was driving just North of Calgary and spotted a 20 acre plot of land in just the right spot for us to bring our next vision to life...

We always felt inspired to share the land with our community, and create a space that met their needs.

We knew right away what we wanted to build: a new kind of community space that could be easily used every day: The Junction on Common

This land needed rezoning so that we could get our vision going. Our first big win came after city council approved our rezoning application! It was after that, that we began to build our team.

We all got down to what we think is the most important part of building a great community space: finding out what you want and need! We've been privileged to hear your thoughts and ideas so far, and we look forward to continuing to develop this project along with you!

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Behind our accomplishments is a dedicated team of leaders, staff, and volunteers whose passion and commitment drive our work.


Our thoughtful growth has expanded our operational capabilities while ensuring fiscal responsibility.
